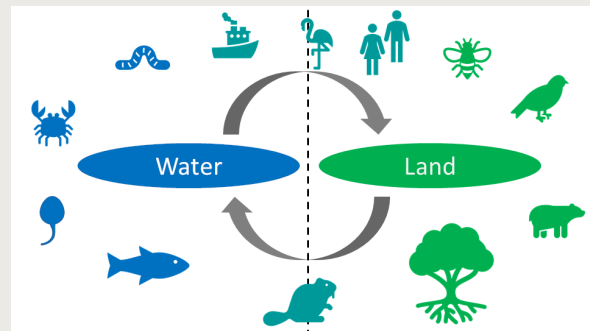
Walks will be about one hour in length, and include tidbits on the natural and cultural history of the area.

Updates from the Land



What is that thing? Over one hundred of you responded to the wildlife identification poll in our last email... and results are in!

Half of you agreed with our ID - that this is a fisher "cat," albeit with an oddly positioned or possibly injured tail. Of the other voters, 22% chose groundhog, 19% chose black bear, 8% chose mink, and 3% chose otter.

While all these species have been spotted in Dennis (see some in the photo mashup/overlay below!), black bears are not present-day residents here. However, historically, black bears did roam the Cape, and some of you may recall the friendly **bear who visited Dennis back in 2012** from across the canal. Shall we invite it back?
