... in winter, otters slide on snow and ice to get where they're going? River otters are semiaquatic mammals in the mustelid family, just like mink, weasels, and fishers. They live along the borders of streams, lakes, and coastal wetlands, and can be found swimming in (or sliding near) fresh, brackish, or even full-salt waters.
